

## 2nd Quarter 2025 Walks & Strolls

### Dear Walkers,

Our leaders have once again curated an exciting and diverse programme for this quarter. With 26 walks, 19 strolls, and an additional 4 Ramblers' Heart Healthy strolls, this is our most extensive programme since the onset of Covid. It offers a superb selection of routes that showcase the beauty of Sussex, Surrey, and East Hampshire, stretching from the western reaches of Old Winchester Hill to the eastern edge of our National Park at Eastbourne. Mileages vary from 3 to 16 miles, covering some of the region's beautiful landscapes, with a few unique twists along the way.

This quarter our deputy chairman, Paul Wilkinson, will lead a featured stroll from Wineham to Twineham, where participants may enjoy a short talk and guided tour of the ancient church by the Priest-in-Residence. Meanwhile, Mick Heywood will celebrate his 50<sup>th</sup> stroll with a picturesque route through the Slindon Estate to see the bluebells at Nore Hill.

Other highlights include two more legs of the Greensand Way in early April. Looking ahead, the second half of the trail is scheduled for the end of Q3 and the beginning of Q4, completing this most scenic linear walk.

With such a rich variety of walks and strolls, this season promises to be a memorable one, offering something for everyone to enjoy.

### Notes for walkers:

- Please ensure you have read the 'Walks Guidance Notes' on our website.
- If the walk says: 'Booking by email to', then please contact the leader in advance so that he knows how many walkers to cater for and can notify you of any late alterations.
- Please remember to take care of your own safety on walks and strolls, and make sure you wear appropriate footwear and clothing and that you are fit for the walk or stroll as outlined.
- Make your own way to the meeting place, but please consider the use of car-sharing or public transport where possible. For advice about a particular walk or stroll contact the leader, or the office on the number at the bottom of this page. The code before the grid reference, e.g. 121 or OL10, refers to maps in the OS 1:25,000 Explorer series. The postcode is a guide only; the six-digit grid reference will be more precise and where that may be ambiguous the What3Words address in the format ///word1.word2.word3 more accurate still.
- New walkers: Please note that the start time on the programme is the time we start walking. Arrive at the meeting place at least 15 minutes before this time to allow for putting on boots and listening to the safety briefing from the leader. The finish time is an estimate by the leader and may vary due to conditions on the day of the walk. DoW after the phone number means that the leader's mobile number is to be used for the day of the walk only.
- All routes are circular unless stated otherwise. At lunch breaks, some people have a snack in the pub or café (unless the walk is picnic only) while others eat their packed lunch away from the pub premises and then go there for a drink or coffee. We usually stop for about an hour. Pub lunches at the end of strolls are optional.
- Strolls (shaded) are a maximum of 9 miles. Walks (unshaded) are over 9 miles. Abbreviations in use: CP=Car Park; PCNU=PostCode Not Useful; RSP=Roadside Parking; ORP=Off-Road Parking (i.e. not a car park); well-known trails may also be abbreviated, e.g. SDW=South Downs Way, SBP=Sussex Border Path.
- Dogs: Where permitted, dogs must be under control and owners must do as requested by the leader; extendable leads are prohibited.

The planting of the garden and maintenance is done by Plumpton College as part of its Stanmer campus. The veg and flower beds are beautiful, interesting and informative. Plenty of toilets and refreshment opportunities. We shall walk up to One Garden (0.8 miles) passing Stanmer House. In One Garden, the One Kitchen restaurant has a more modern menu. Smooth lawns and benches for a picnic, a food shop/cafe where we’ll base for refreshment and to explore. Then through Stanmer Village and up a short steep path to the hills. There we have a choice, to take the shortest route down to the park entrance or go up just a little higher to walk back partly through the woods. That makes the longest walk at a total of about 4 miles. It’s all lovely. I intend this to be very flexible; walkers are welcome to leave the group at any point to linger or to avoid the hilly bit or to lunch at Stanmer House as there is no way of getting lost – just make sure I know. <i>Notes: Car parks to the left and right as you enter Stanmer Park.
